Judge Erika Tindill

Judge Erika Tindill was appointed to the bench by Governor Dannel Malloy in March 2014 and was sworn in as a Superior Court Judge in April 2014. Judge Tindill currently sits in the Stamford-Norwalk Judicial District hearing criminal, domestic violence, and family matters. She served in the Malloy administration as Chair of the Connecticut Board of Pardons and Paroles from 2011 to 2014. Prior to her appointments, she held the positions of Executive Director of the Connecticut Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Deputy Director for New Haven Legal Assistance Association, Inc. Prior to coming to Connecticut, she served as an Assistant State Attorney specializing in domestic violence prosecution in Dade County, Florida. Judge Tindill is a Council of State Governments Henry Toll Fellow and a James W. Cooper Fellow of the Connecticut Bar Foundation. She was a 2014 Urban League of Southern Connecticut Women of Power honoree. She has served on the boards of Domestic Violence Services of Greater New Haven, the Rape Crisis Center of Milford, and Connecticut Humanities as director. She has been an adjunct professor in the Legal Studies department at Quinnipiac University since 2000. Judge Tindill earned a B.A. in Economics and Spanish from Bucknell University and studied the European Economic Community and Spanish Constitutional Law in Madrid, Spain through the College of William and Mary. She earned a Juris Doctor degree from Albany Law School of Union University in Albany, NY.
